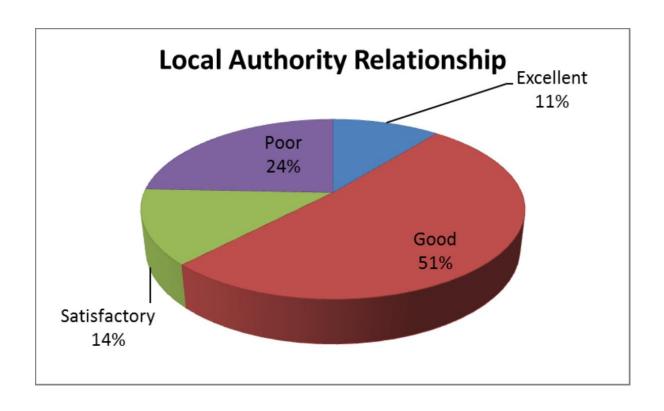

Top Tips (1)

- Use your contacts and find a 'sherpa'.
- Get to know your local authority and how it works. Speak their language.
- Be clear about what your group aims to achieve.
- The first approach matters –be the solution and show how you can be useful.
- Inform and involve your elected members.

Top Tips (2)

- Relationships need continuous support be patient!
- Set realistic expectations.
- Have, or always be prepared to develop, a Plan B.
- See change as positive and adapt.
- Prioritise and build in capacity for engagement.
